Harvest Festival Friday 2nd October	A letter with more information will be sent out soon. Our assembly takes place in the form of an assembly in school with the collection for the local food bank.

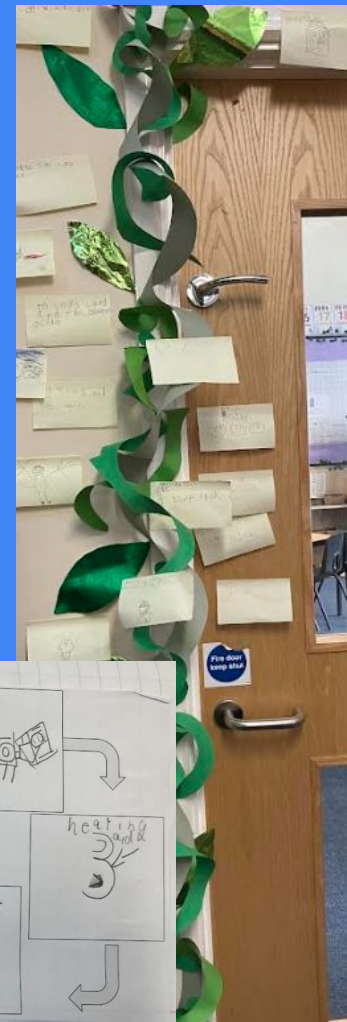
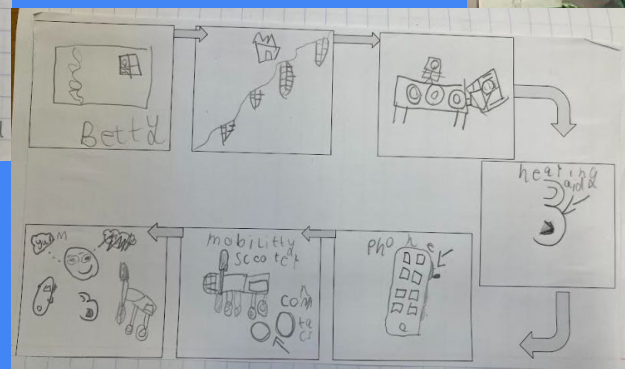
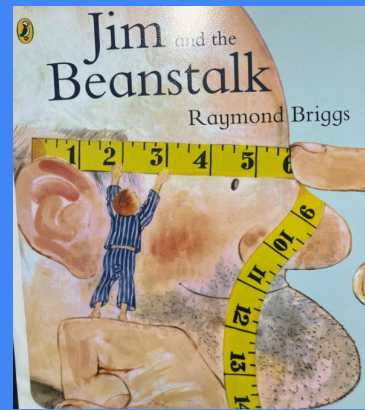


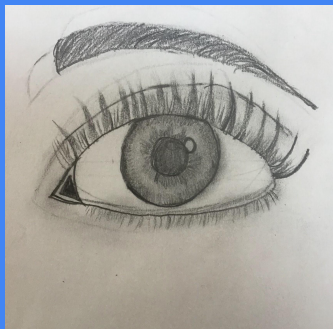
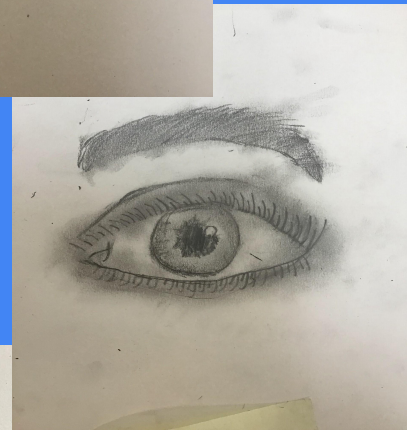
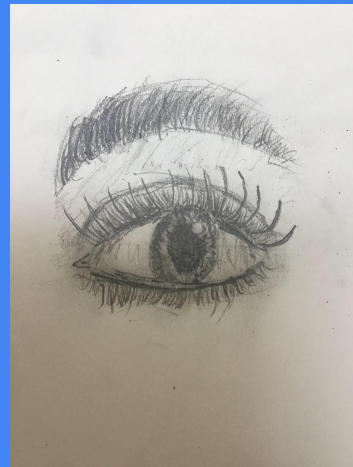
LEARNING IN ACTION...

Year 2

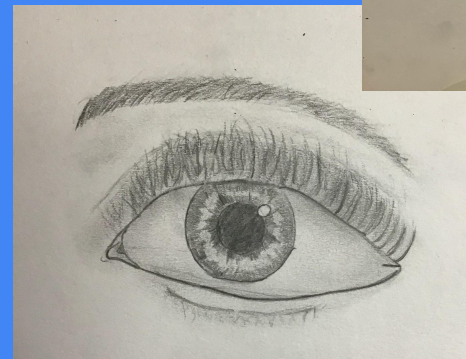
Last week, Year 2 found a large beanstalk in their classrooms. They have using the story 'Jim and the Beanstalk' to inspire their own versions of the story.

Pay close attention to what children are interested in. This joint engagement lets children know that what they are interested in is important to you too.

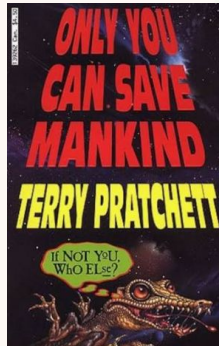
